2. ABOUT M.Sc. (APPLIED NUTRITION) & M.Sc. (SPORTS NUTRITION)

Vision

To create scientifically trained human resources in the area of Applied Nutrition and Sports Science who will make a positive contribution to society.

Mission

To equip post-graduate students with knowledge and skills in multi-disciplinary area of Applied Nutrition and Sports Nutrition, thereby enabling them to contribute in the field of nutrition and/or sports nutrition.

M.Sc. (Applied Nutrition)

The ICMR-National Institute of Nutrition (NIN) has reached a remarkable milestone of completing 107 years of exemplary service to the nation with special emphasis on overcoming the nutritional deficiency disorders. The NIN looks forward to recast its focus with a renewed commitment not just to nutritional science, but also for building a healthy nation. Systematic training programmes have been initiated to impart training in the current concepts of nutritional science and their application for promoting public health. This was initiated by introducing training programmes and certificate courses. A nine-month M.Sc. (Applied Nutrition) Postgraduate Programme was initiated in 1968 to create skilled human resources in nutritional sciences to address the nutritional problems in India. This course was initially open to sponsored candidates, and later considering the usefulness of this programme and demand in the market, it was upgraded to a Full-time Two-year M.Sc. programme in Applied Nutrition in the year 2009. The students who passed out from the course are employed in teaching and research positions across the globe and continue to contribute in disseminating knowledge about nutritional sciences as young ambassadors of the National Institute of Nutrition. From the academic year 2024-25 onwards, this course runs is affiliated to Academy of Scientific and Innovative Research (AcSIR), Ghaziabad, Uttar Pradesh.

M.Sc. (Sports Nutrition)

Research in the area of Sports Nutrition was initiated in 1983 under the Energy Metabolism Division, which was subsequently developed as the Department of Work Physiology and Sports Nutrition at ICMR-National Institute of Nutrition (NIN). After three decades of research, consultancy, and extension in the specialized area of Sports Nutrition, viewing the importance of sports science for performance and growth, the department started the Two-year M.Sc. (Sports Nutrition) course supported by the Indian Institute of Sports Science & Research (IISSR), Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports (MYAS), Govt. of India and established MYAS - NIN Department of Sports Science in the year 2017. This course is the first ever course of its kind in the country. From the academic year 2024-25 onwards, this course is affiliated to Academy of Scientific and Innovative Research (AcSIR), Ghaziabad, Uttar Pradesh.

ABOUT THE PROGRAMME

M.Sc. (**Applied Nutrition**): The M.Sc. Applied Nutrition course follows Semester System and Choice Based Credit System as per the guidelines issued by University Grants Commission (UGC). The curriculum has been planned in consultation with renowned academicians, researchers, and clinicians in various specialties of nutritional sciences and is designed with an application-oriented approach.

M.Sc. (**Sports Nutrition**): The M.Sc. Sports Nutrition course follows the Semester System and Choice Based Credit System as per the guidelines issued by UGC. The curriculum has been planned in consultation with MYAS, International and National experts in the area of sports-specific nutrition and is executed with an application-oriented approach.

Objectives of the M.Sc. (Applied Nutrition) Programme

- To develop in-depth knowledge and understanding of the various applications of nutritional sciences in public health and clinical settings to address nutritional deficiencies.
- To gain knowledge and skills needed for planning and management of community and public health nutrition programmes implemented by the Government and NGOs.
- To acquire skills in nutritional assessment and nutritional planning for the application of theoretical concepts in field settings.
- To acquire research, , academic skills, paper publication/presentation and scholarly skills or specific skills needed for entrepreneurship to increase employability.

Objectives of the M.Sc. (Sports Nutrition) Programme

- To develop in-depth knowledge and practical skill sets to ensure planning and implementation of sport-specific nutritional support to Indian athletes/sports persons.
- To develop a team approach, display adequate team building and soft skills to ensure implementation and monitoring of sport-specific nutritional support.
- To develop research, academic skills, paper publication/presentation skills or specific skills needed for entrepreneurship or gain job experience to improve employability. To develop day-to-day support requirements of athletes, critical analysis of situations and problem-solving within a team, with specific reference to providing support to elite athletes during training and during international and national events.

2.4 EXAMINATION & EVALUATION PROCEDURE FOR COURSE-WORK

Continuous evaluation procedure will be carried-out throughout the semester through class-tests, assignments, seminars, mid-term and end-semester examinations, etc.

- End-semester examination shall have maximum weightage of 40%.
- For laboratory courses, the students shall have to submit laboratory reports to the course coordinator.

Depending on nature of the laboratory work, the coordinator can opt for a viva-voce at the end.

^{* &}quot;I" grade shall be given to students who have (i) Not Attended Classes; and/or (ii) Not been evaluated. This implies repeating the full course and appearing in the examination so that it could be considered towards final grade calculation.

SGPA (Semester Grade Point Average) = {Sum of (Course credit x Numerical value of course grade)}/ Total course credits earned in the semester

CGPA (Cumulative Grade Point Average) = {Sum of (Course credit in all passed courses x Numerical value of course grade)} / Cumulative credits earned

A brief philosophy of AcSIR indicating the "Award of Grades in Courses" is given as Annexure – I

For Masters' and PG-Diploma programs a student needs to have a SGPA \geq 6.0 in each semester and a CGPA \geq 6.5 from second semester onwards for continuation.

- The minimum grade point to be earned to pass any individual subject is 6.0.
- The SGPA and CGPA shall be calculated to two decimal places.
- Distinction# \geq 8.00 CGPA; First Class \geq 7.00 CGPA; Pass Marks \geq 6.50 CGPA
- CGPA to %age conversion formula: %age of marks = $(CGPA 0.5) \times 10$ (Master's program)

The award of Distinction would be considered only if all the courses are passed in one attempt.

Conducting a "Re-test":

A re-test can only be taken once for:

- a) Passing a course i.e. when the student has failed
- b) Improvement in SGPA/CGPA

Final grades obtained after taking the re-test shall only be considered valid and mentioned on the final grade card. The re-test can be taken on payment of any additional examination fee as prescribed by the administration.

Students desirous of taking a re-test shall have to give their request in writing.

2.5 EXAMINATION & EVALUATION OF DISSERTATION

Dissertation

a. The **Oral Examination Board (OEB)** for each student shall be constituted by the Director of the laboratory on the recommendation of the Institute Coordinator and the dissertation supervisor.

The OEB shall have a minimum of three members:

- One examiner from same field of research,
- One examiner from areas other than the candidate's field of research and
- The dissertation supervisor(s).
- b. The candidate, at the earliest, would be allowed to submit the thesis two weeks before the completion of the fourth semester (middle of April) with recommendation of the dissertation supervisor.
- c. The last date for submission of the Master's Dissertation is 15th May of every calendar year.
- d. The candidate shall present his dissertation work in the colloquium in presence of the OEB members.
- e. The notification of the open seminar would be circulated by the dissertation supervisor in consultation with members of the OEB.
- f. The candidate is considered to have passed the oral examination if all the OEB members consider that the performance of the candidate is satisfactory with award of grades C+ or above.
- g. Based on the presentation and responses to the questions raised during oral examination, the OEB can even recommend the resubmission of the dissertation (only once) after incorporating the suggestions made by the OEB.
- h. In the rescheduled oral examination, the OEB must declare the candidate either to have passed or failed with award of appropriate grades. There shall not be any recommendation for further oral examination.

2.6 AWARD OF DEGREE, PROVISION OF REAPPEARING & ATTENDANCE

A student shall be awarded the degree on the following conditions:

- 2.6.1 He/she must have registered himself/herself to undergo the chosen course of study, completed the internship and project report specified in the curriculum of his/her program within the stipulated time, and secured the minimum credits and CGPA prescribed for the award of the concerned degree.
 - (i) There are no dues outstanding in the student's name to be paid to the Institute/University.
 - (ii) No disciplinary action should be pending against the student.
 - (iii) The student should have earned minimum credits (i.e., total credits offered in the Program number of credits, not exceeding six credits).
 - (iv) Distinction ≥ 8.00 CGPA; First class ≥ 7.00 CGPA and Pass marks ≥ 6.50 CGPA

The above degree will be awarded with distinction, if a student has earned a minimum CGPA of ≥ 8 with a pass in all subjects in the first attempt.

The maximum permissible period for completing the program is minimum 2 years and maximum 3 years from the date of admission. However, if a student fails to do so, he/she may be permitted to register again for the program after obtaining the requisite approval from the concerned authorities of NIN and AcSIR.

Attendance

Candidates, once admitted, are required to have not less than 75% of attendance in lectures (and practical wherever applicable). The Director, ICMR-NIN on the specific recommendation of the Course Coordinator, may condone the deficiency in attendance to the extent of 10% on medical grounds, subject to production of satisfactory Medical Certificate and on payment of the prescribed condonation fee. No admission will be made after the expiry of four (4) weeks from the date of commencement of instructions.

2.7 CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION

If any candidate is found to secure admission on the basis of false information with respect to age, subject, percentage of marks, false claims on special/reservation categories etc., his/her admission will be cancelled, and punitive action will be initiated.

IMPORTANT

It may be noted that all those who will appear entrance examination and qualify for provisional admission will not entitle for any claim on admission if she/he does not fulfill the required eligibility conditions for admission as prescribed in the Prospectus-cum-application form 2025-27 which will be verified at the time of counseling for admission. In addition, at any stage (during the pursuance of the course/program if it is found that any candidate does not fulfill the minimum eligibility requirements or had submitted a fake educational or caste certificate, the provisional admission that was granted, shall be cancelled forthwith. Bringing in political pressure/ influence in any manner at any stage i.e. entrance examination, admission that was granted, shall be cancelled forthwith.

3. ABOUT N-CET (NIN-COMMON ENTRANCE TEST)

N-CET is an All-India Common Entrance Test and counseling for admission into the M.Sc. (Applied Nutrition) and M.Sc. (Sports Nutrition) Courses conducted by ICMR-National Institute of Nutrition, Hyderabad, Telangana State. ICMR-NIN, in association with M/s Scope Testing Services Pvt. Ltd., will conduct computer-based test (online examination) at multicentres across India. It is mandatory for candidates to appear for the entrance test and the marks of the entrance test will be considered for admission, along with the marks of qualifying degree (in case of tie in Entrance Test marks) and reservation policy given in 'seat matrix' – page No. 13.

4. EXAMINATION PROCEDURE

4.1 SYLLABUS

The syllabus for the entrance examination is the basic understanding of nutrition, biochemistry and physiology taught at the graduation level, general knowledge & aptitude.

4.2 PATTERN OF THE ENTRANCE TEST & NEGATIVE MARKING

The candidates need to appear for the entrance test, which will be based on the multiple-choice questions (MCQs) format. The Entrance Test will be for 100 marks. The test will cover the following four subjects, and the marks will be allotted as shown below.

Note: NEGATIVE MARKS FOR WRONG ANSWERS

4.2.1 **Negative marks are applicable.** 1/3rd (0.33) mark will be deducted for each incorrect answer i.e., for every three wrong answers, one mark will be deducted. A merit list shall be prepared based on marks obtained (after deduction of negative marks) in the Entrance Test.

- 4.2.2 In case of a tie of marks in the Entrance Test, the total percentage of the marks in the qualifying examination (up to two decimal places) will be taken into consideration for fixing the merit of candidates.
- 4.2.3 If the entrance test marks and the percentage of marks in the qualifying examination are equal, the age of the candidate will be taken into consideration, and older candidates will be placed higher in the merit list.

4.3 MODE OF EXAMINATION

N-CET exam will be computer-based and the candidate is required to answer the MCQs on the system allotted to them in their respective exam center.

4.4 DURATION OF EXAMINATION

The duration of the exam will be ninety (90) minutes

4.5 MEDIUM OF QUESTION PAPER & MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION: ENGLISH

4.6 CENTER PREFERENCES FOR N-CET 2025

The centers for the Entrance exam are **HYDERABAD**, **NEW DELHI**, **KOLKATA**, **MUMBAI**, **CHENNAI**, **BENGALURU** and **VISAKHAPATNAM**. However, candidates need to provide their order of preferences of Exam center in the online application. Candidates may choose their own city or select the neighboring city based on their convenience and the center options.

In case, the number of candidates opting for a city/ center is less than a certain minimum required, candidates may be allotted to a center in another city, irrespective of the center preferences provided by the candidates for appearing for the examination.

5. ELIGIBILITY AND QUALIFICATIONS

As given in Page No. 1.

In addition, the candidate should possess a minimum of 55% aggregate marks in the qualifying examination for General (UR), General (EWS).

General (UR), General (EWS) candidates should possess 55% and OBC/SC/ST/PWD candidates should possess a minimum of 50% aggregate marks in the qualifying examination. Candidates who are appearing for the final B.Sc. exam are also eligible for N-CET. However, they should submit all the original certificates of the qualifying exams **at the time of counseling for admission.** Candidates though qualified in the Entrance Test, are not entitled to participate in the counseling for admission if the requisite certificates are not submitted.

Note: If a candidate is found to have concealed any information regarding the eligibility criteria, the registration will be cancelled. Further, disciplinary action will be taken by the concerned authorities against the candidate.

6.2 SCRUTINY OF CERTIFICATES

After the N-CET examination, the results with marks obtained by each candidate will be uploaded on the NIN website.

After scrutiny of certificates, the list of eligible candidates for counseling will be displayed on the NIN website (www.nin.res.in).

Based on the entrance test marks/rank and submission of requisite certificates, admissions will be made through Spot/ Physical Counseling at NIN, Hyderabad. Date and time will be notified along with the list of eligible candidates.

6.3 QUALIFYING CRITERIA

The Merit List will be prepared on the basis of the marks scored by the candidates in the N-CET examination. Reservation policy will be followed for OBC, SC/ST/EWS candidates as per reservation policy of Government of India.

6.4 SELECTION OF CANDIDATES

The selected candidates, who have qualified for the entrance exam and fulfilled the criteria, will be uploaded on the NIN website and individual email **will not** be sent.

After the admission procedure is completed, the final list of selected candidates (who have submitted all original certificates and paid the stipulated fee) will be displayed on the website. Seat confirmation/ allotment are confirmed only on payment of fees immediately i.e. the same day of seat allotment.

6.5 HOSTEL ACCOMMODATION

The students who secure admission at NIN will be eligible for hostel accommodation. The hostel rooms are reserved as per the government rules for SC/ST/OBC/EWS.

The hostel is well equipped with furniture, Wi-Fi and has LCD television besides other facilities. The hostel rooms are spacious and well furnished. The hostel also includes a dining facility, and students are not allowed to cook in their hostel rooms. It provides all the students a safe and comfortable environment. It is a "zero tolerance for ragging" and a "No Smoking Zone."

Admission to the hostel will be given as per the merit and the following categorization:

Category A: 95% of seats will consist of those students whose parents are not residing in or around Hyderabad. Proof of residence has to be submitted for the same.

Category B: 5% of the seats will consist of those students whose parents are not residing in Hyderabad but 20 km or more from the NIN. Proof of residence has to be submitted for the same.

A candidate may apply for Hostel Accommodation on a prescribed form only after confirmation of his/her seat.

Any candidate not fulfilling the attendance requirement during the current academic year will be denied the hostel seat in the next academic session.

6.6 ANTI-RAGGING REGULATIONS

The Anti-Ragging cell of ICMR-National Institute of Nutrition includes the Anti-Ragging Committee and the Anti-Ragging Squad. This committee will ensure compliance with the provisions of the Anti-ragging regulations prescribed by the UGC. The students (along with their parents signature) have to register on the portal and submit an Anti-ragging related undertaking (online) at the time of admission stating that they will not indulge in any form of ragging. ICMR-National Institute of Nutrition and its hostel facilities for students have zero tolerance for Ragging and will take all measures to ensure a Ragging-free campus.

Students found to indulge in any form of ragging during any time of the Two-year M.Sc. course are liable to have their admission cancelled and their candidature may be withdrawn from the course.

UGC has issued an advisory regarding the revised procedure of Anti-Ragging undertaking & Compliance Submission. The students are instructed to fill online undertaking and also submit Anti-Ragging compliance form on www.antiragging.in. 7. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS AND SUBMISSION OF APPLICATION FORM/ PAYMENT OF FEES

7.1 GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

The Online Application link given on the NIN website will enable the candidate to complete the registration and online application process. On clicking the link, the candidate will be first directed to the registration process. Under the Registration process, the candidate will be required to enter basic details like his/her name, social status, mobile number, email id, educational qualification. Candidate has to choose his/her basic eligible degree from the drop down box at the time of registration process.

7.2 INSTRUCTIONS FOR FILLING THE ONLINE APPLICATION FORM

After paying the registration fees online and entering the payment reference number, the candidate can start entering all details in the online application form. After filling the online application form, the candidate has to upload a photograph (<50kb jpg, jpeg format) and click on save and submit button. The candidate can download a PDF of the filled-in application form after submission is completed.

Note: Incomplete applications and applications not in accordance with the instructions are liable to be rejected without any further intimation.

8. PREPARATION OF MERIT LIST OF ENTRANCE TEST

The Merit list shall be prepared on the basis of the marks obtained in the Entrance Test. In case of a tie of marks in the Entrance Test, the total percentage of the marks in the qualifying examination (up to two decimal places) will be taken into consideration for fixing the merit of candidates. If the entrance test marks and the percentage of marks in the qualifying examination are equal, the age of the candidate will be taken into consideration and older candidates will be placed higher in the merit list.

9. RESERVATION OF SEATS

Reservation of seats is as per AcSIR guidelines (please refer 6.1 Page No.13)

Note: Every candidate who claims to belong to SC or ST or OBC (non-creamy layer) or EWS has to produce a certificate to ICMR-NIN, before her/his admission as sufficient proof in support of the claim, to make her/him eligible for various relaxations and concessions granted to such candidates.

The certificate should strictly be in prescribed format issued by one of the competent authorities empowered for the purpose. No other certificate will be accepted as sufficient proof of the claim belonging to any reserved category for availing the benefits of reservations.

The admission granted to all such reserved candidates is provisional and subject to the certificates being verified through proper channels as per rules and if the verification reveals that the claim of a candidate who belongs to SC/ST/OBC/EWS as the case may be, is false the admission will be cancelled forthwith without assigning any further reasons without prejudice to such further action as may be taken under the provisions of the Indian Penal Code for production of false certificates.

Candidates producing SC/ST certificates issued by the competent authority of the respective State Governments should also produce a certificate of valid duration at the time of admission.

The Other Backward Classes (OBC) **non-creamy layer** certificate should be issued in the format as prescribed by the Govt. of India time-to-time issued by the competent authority on or after 1.4.2024. It may please be noted that state Backward Classes (BC) certificate will not be accepted as a claim for reservation under OBC.

If it is brought to the notice of ICMR-NIN at any stage i.e. while pursuing a course or after the degree is awarded that the candidate got admission based on false certificate and is proved, then University reserves the right to cancel the admission/degree awarded as the case may be and also take action as per the provisions of the Indian Penal Code for production of a false certificate. The university also reserves the right to send any or all caste certificates for verification as per the Government of India rules.

AWARD OF GRADES IN COURSES

Brief philosophy of awarding the academic letter grades in courses

CGPA = Summation of Ci Gi
Summation of Ci

Where Ci represents credit points and Gi represents grade points.

Based on the philosophy, letter grade does not allow the fractions. The grades have to be within the ranges of A+, A, B+, B, C+ in order to pass the course. Please note that at AcSIR "C" is a fail grade. Therefore, while mapping the absolute marks onto the letter grades the investigator in-charge has to be sure what grade he wants to award. One student may get 55 or 58 (out of 100) as his/her actual marks, but the onus is on the Instructor to declare whether the candidate is C+ or C. The Instructor has the liberty to declare 58 as C+ and he has to be convinced that the candidate deserves a C+ grade. Likewise, the investigator in-charge has to assign A+, A etc based on the performance of the students in the course. Ideally, the instructor has to draw a histogram based on the performance (absolute marks) of the students in the course. Then he has to decide what should be the minimum pass mark for that course. He/ she has to then decide on a range (say minimum + X marks, X being 6 or 7 or 8 marks) and assign that range as C+, the immediate upper range (again he/she has to decide the range based on the trend of the histogram) should be assigned a letter grade of B and so on. If the instructor sees that nobody is truly outstanding in the histogram, he need not even award A+ in that course for that particular batch of students. The Instructor is free to choose the minimum pass marks (and hence the pass grade is mapped there) depending on the standard of the examinations/ assignments and the standard of performance of the students in the course.

The numerical interpretation of the letter grade has only relation to the calculation of SGPA and CGPA. But letter grade cannot be interpreted as a fractional number. For example, if an Instructor has awarded B+ grade to somebody, then the student earns full 8.0 grade point on that course. The grade point cannot be 8.2 or 7.8. The grade point will be multiplied by the corresponding credit of the course and then SGPA or CGPA will be calculated based on the formula given above.

Whenever a large number of student's grades in a course fall on either extreme of the spectrum, they shall be discussed/reviewed by the concerned course coordinator and AcSIR Laboratory Coordinator in consultation with the Laboratory Director, if required.
